

Do you need a Company Driver Program or Fleet Safety Program?

Have you ever wondered what you are required to do if you have employees who drive on company time?

If you answered yes to all or most of the questions you probably need a Fleet program. The Department of Transportation regulates “*Fleet Safety Programs*”.

A Fleet Safety Program is needed if:

1. *Company vehicles are more than 26,001 lbs. (GVW)
2. *Company vehicles use air brakes
3. *Company drivers require a Class “A” or “B” driver’s license

Drivers may also need a specific endorsement to operate vehicles based on the transported cargo.

If you answered yes to any of the questions you need a Company Driver Program. The difference between this and the Fleet Safety Program is simple; the “*Company Driver Program*” is self-regulated and usually deals with drivers that:

1. Drive company vehicles or their personal vehicle for company business
2. Drivers only possess a Class “C” driver’s license
3. Vehicles do not have air-operated brakes
4. Vehicles are less than 26,001 lbs. (GVW)
