

What is the 2009 TICF Assessment?

The Cal/OSHA Targeted Inspection and Consultation Fund (TICF) is part of the workers' compensation insurance reform legislation passed by the California Legislature in July of 1993. The legal mandate for the assessment is codified at California Labor Code §62.7 and §62.9. The Assessment amounts were revised effective January 2009.

Which California employers are subject to a TICF Assessment?

Insured employers with an experience modification rating (Ex-MOD) of 125% or more.

How often are TICF assessments made?

Annually - Typically, TICF assessments are mailed to employers in March or April of every year. See Labor Code

How is the amount of the TICF assessment calculated?

The amount of your assessment is based on your total payroll as reported to your workers' compensation insurance carrier covering the last full year of payroll.

The law says you must pay the assessment within thirty (30) days from the date of the Billing Notice.
