True Story

While utilizing a stand-up rider jack, an employee collided with another team member using a forklift. The operator of the rider jack suffered severe injuries from the forklift.

Lessons Learned

While operating workplace equipment, employees should:

- $\cdot \;$ Travel at a safe speed
- Slow down and honk the horn when going around a blind corner
- Drive a forklift with forks fully lowered
- Look in the direction of travel while reversing the equipment

Prevention Tips

Consider the following to avoid serious injuries:

- Provide training and refreshers upon observation of unsafe practices
- Establish and adequately communicate the organization's disciplinary policy for unsafe practices and provide managers with the authority to implement it
