

True Story

While completing routine work, employees were utilizing a woodchipper. As they were doing so, a large explosion occurred, which resulted in significant injuries.

Lessons Learned

- Gas and gas-powered equipment should be stored away from a woodchipper
- Do not place tools in the empty housing unit to transport equipment
- Ensure employees are aware of equipment and that it remains away from the woodchipper
- Train new employees on the proper transportation and use of a woodchipper
- · Have a manager or supervisor onsite
- · Contact Cal/OSHA after a serious injury

Prevention Tips

- · Train and supervise new employees
- · Inspect equipment prior to use
- Do not store any materials in the interior housing unit or close to machinery that could become entangled with moving parts – place them in the bed of the truck or secure them to the outside of the vehicle
- · Always wear personal protection equipment (PPE)
